Between Vesuvius and the Gulf of Naples, the land quakes from time to time, and the fumaroles of the Phlegraean Fields taint the air. The ruins that lie below — Pompeii, Herculaneum, long-submerged Roman villas — tell of a future that was buried by time. From these traces of history, memories of the subterranean world, in black and white, a lesser-known Naples emerges and fills with lives.

Below the clouds lies a territory criss-crossed by inhabitants, worshippers, tourists and archaeologists excavating the past — and by those who, in museums, strive to give new life and meaning to statues, fragments and ruins. The train that rings Vesuvius makes its rounds as racehorses train along the shore. A teacher runs a makeshift after-school for children and adolescents. Firefighters in their command centre try to calm the fears of locals who call in; law enforcement pursue tomb robbers, while in Torre Annunziata, Syrian tankers unload Ukrainian grain.

A team of Japanese archaeologists continue their twenty-year excavation of Villa Augustea, extracting history from seeds, bones and layers of sediment. Tourists wander the ruins of Pompeii, and worshippers prostrate themselves at the church of the Madonna dell'Arco, where the crypts and ex-votos attest to the belief of a world that has survived. The land that skirts the Gulf is a vast time machine.

PORTOBELLO

Portobello recounts one of Italy's most sensational miscarriages of justice: the story of television presenter Enzo Tortora, the tragic events that led to the ruin of an innocent man.

1982: Enzo Tortora is at the height of his success. He hosts Portobello and reaches 28 million viewers in prime time, all waiting for the contestant who can get the parrot, the show's guest of honour, to speak. President Pertini names him Commander of the Republic. Tortora is the king of television in the 1980s, and his programme chronicles and comforts the country.

During those same years, the Irpinia earthquake deals the final blow to the already fragile balance of the crime syndicate Nuova Camorra Organizzata. Giovanni Pandico, a trusted man of boss Raffaele Cutolo and a regular viewer of Portobello from his cell, decides to confess. When questioned by the judges, he gives them an unexpected name: Enzo Tortora.

When, on June 17, 1983, the Carabinieri knocked on the door of his hotel room, Tortora thought it was a mistake, but it was only the beginning of an odyssey that would drag him from the top to the abyss.

Eleonora Duse's legendary career seems over, but in the ferocious times between the Great War and the rise of fascism, the Divina feels a call stronger than any resignation and returns to where her life began: on stage.

It's not just the call to acting that drives her, but a profound urgency: the need to reaffirm herself in a world that is inexorably changing and threatens to take everything from her, even the independence she earned with a lifetime of work. Unexpected financial setbacks force her to make a choice, and so, once again, Eleonora chooses the theatre as the only space of truth and resistance. With her art as her only weapon, she defies time and disenchantment, transforming every word and gesture into a revolutionary act. But the price of beauty against the brutality of power and history is high: her loved ones seem to fade away, and her health deteriorates. Yet, Eleonora will face her final journey, demonstrating that one can renounce life itself, but never one's own nature.


